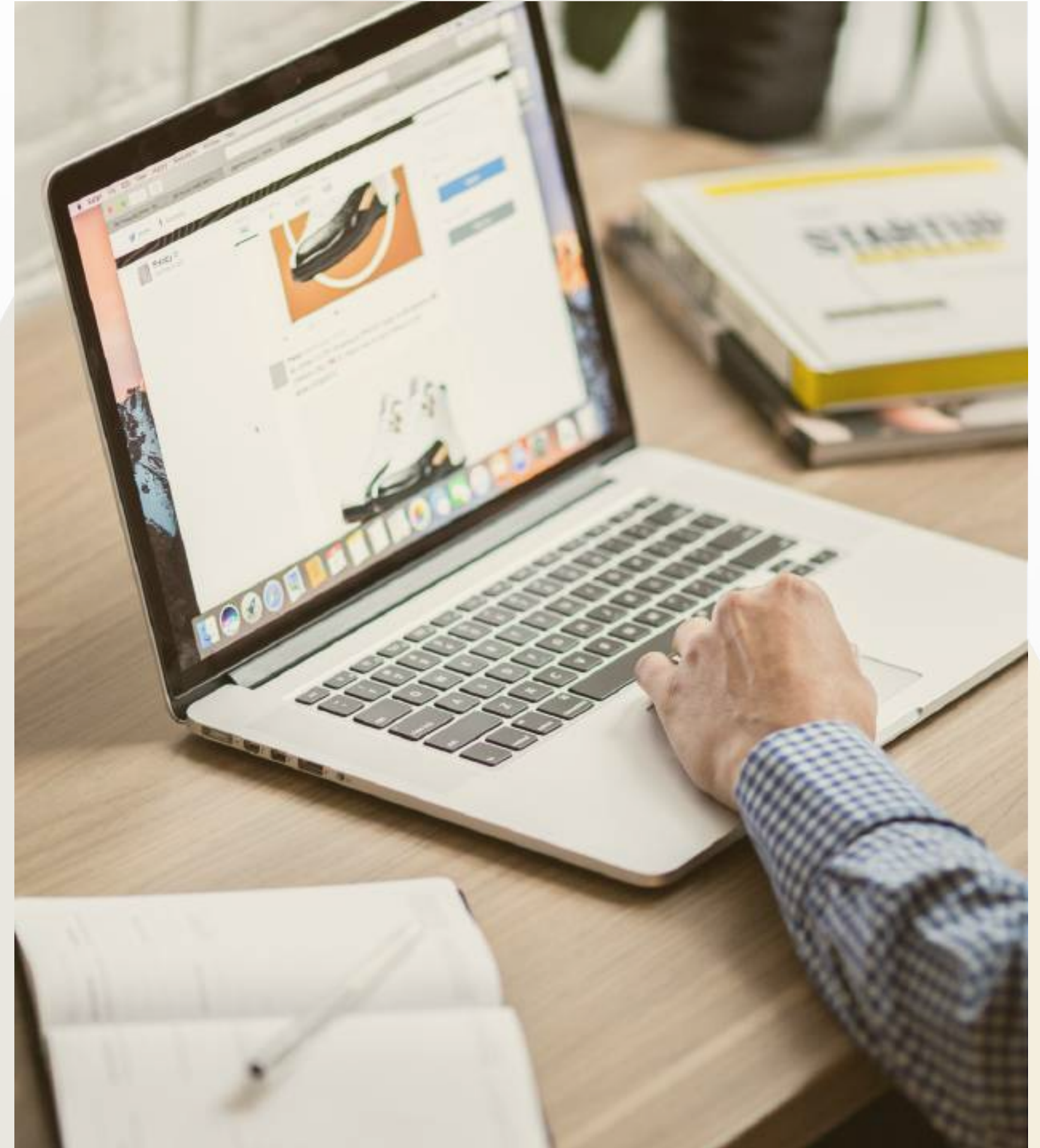
Introduction to BA Training Program.

BA Elicitation and Collaboration

This course will teach you how to gather information and understand the needs of a business.

BAs use elicitation and collaborative techniques to achieve a shared understanding of business analysis information.





Eliciting User Requirements

In this course, you will learn the process of determining what the customers actually need. Eliciting requirements is a system used to document important information so that the analyst can later write a more formal requirements document.

Requirements Analysis (and Design Definition)

This lesson walks through several techniques using real life case studies as examples in this course. It is absolutely essential that business requirements are thoroughly analyzed, during their collection and throughout the project's life cycle.



Requirements Life Cycle Management

This course outlines the activities carried out by a business analyst to manage and sustain requirements from initialization through final execution. Monitoring, planning, analyzing, controlling, and communicating organizational requirements are all part of the process.

Solution Evaluation
